- The University of Passau has an above-average performance, especially in terms of research, internationality and publication of articles in scientific journals.







Entry requirements for the M.Sc. Business Administration


• Academic requirements

- First degree in business administration, economics or related discipline with a final grade of 2.7 (German grading scale) or better
- Business/economics content of degree must at least be 60 ECTS, including at least 10 ECTS in economic/business research methods (e.g. data collection, data analysis, mathematics or statistics)
- For applications with a degree in a non-signatory state to the Lisbon Convention: Additional requirement of a GMAT score with at least 600 points (10th edition) or 565 points (Focus Edition) (changed from 550 points in the last application round)

Language requirements

- English language skills at level B2 CEFR
- German language skills at level A1 CEFR (by the end of first year)


