Ph.D. position in Political Economy and Development

The Chair for Political Economy of Developing and Transition Countries (Prof. Michaelowa) is looking for a new Ph.D. candidate to be employed as a research/teaching assistant (50% employment).

The position starts in summer/fall 2013 (exact start date negotiable) and does not have a fixed duration (the candidate is expected to finish his/her Ph.D. in 3-4 years).

Job Description

The job entails the following opportunities and duties.

- (1) Research and teaching in the areas of development economics and politics, with own research interests ideally in areas related to education, development aid, international climate policy, or the functioning of international organizations (for an overview of ongoing research projects see <u>http://www.research-projects.uzh.ch/a127.htm</u>).
- (2) Preparation of international conferences, including the support of related refereeing processes, management of the conference website, and diverse coordination tasks, within the large network of the Development Economics Committee within the German Economic Association (VfS; <u>http://www.ael.ethz.ch/default_eng.htm</u>)..
- (3) Moreover, the candidate is expected to pursue a PhD in one of the areas mentioned under (1) and to participate in the CIS doctoral program (<u>http://www.cis.ethz.ch/education/phd</u>).

Requirements

- M.A. in Economics or Political Science.
- Strong background in quantitative empirical methods (econometrics, statistics).
- For political scientists: basic knowledge of economics, ideally economics as a minor subject.
- A good command of English. Knowledge of German is a plus.
