Subject to final approval of funds, the position may be filled as of 01 July 2017 and is limited to four years with a possible extension of five years.

The researchers will carry out research and policy advice in the interdisciplinary research group "Sustainable Middle Classes in Middle Income Countries: Transforming Carbon Consumption Patterns", funded by the Federal Ministry of Education and Research. They contribute to the development of the project's conceptual and methodological frameworks to analyze consumer behavior of the growing middle classes in developing countries, and each conduct household surveys and qualitative case studies in Ghana, Peru or the Philippines. The sought-after researchers will be charged with the collaboration with the local research partners and will produce joint publications and policy advice products with them. Furthermore, they will contribute to the organization of project workshops and the communication to relevant target groups.

The researchers will pursue a PhD thesis within the project and will be part of the regular institutional life.

Qualifications and requirements:

- One person with a Master with very good grades in development economics and/or behavioral economics;
- One person with a Master with very good grades in psychology with a focus on social psychology;
- Proven knowledge and experience with quantitative methods, knowledge of experimental methods and first experience with qualitative methods are an asset;
- Research or work experience in developing countries is an asset;
- Willingness to work in an interdisciplinary team and proven organizational skills;
- Fluent written and spoken English, good knowledge of Spanish is an asset;
- Willingness and aptness to travel abroad, including countries with a tropical climate ("Tropentauglichkeit").
