The doctoral researchers will carry out socioeconomic research related to agricultural production, food consumption, and nutrition in East Africa (especially Kenya). Using randomized controlled trials (RCTs) and household surveys, the impacts of pro-nutrition innovations and new approaches of community outreach will be evaluated. The positions will be based in Göttingen, but will require repeated travel to East Africa.

Successful candidates will have an outstanding Master's degree in agricultural economics, development economics, or a related discipline, strong analytical skills, experience with quantitative research methods (especially econometrics), proven interest in development topics, strong computer skills, and excellent command of the English language. Experience with data collection in developing countries will be a plus.
